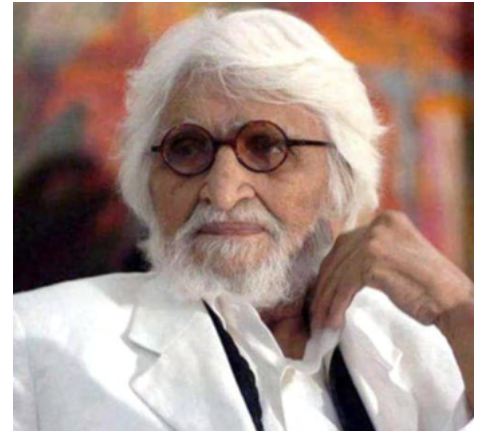

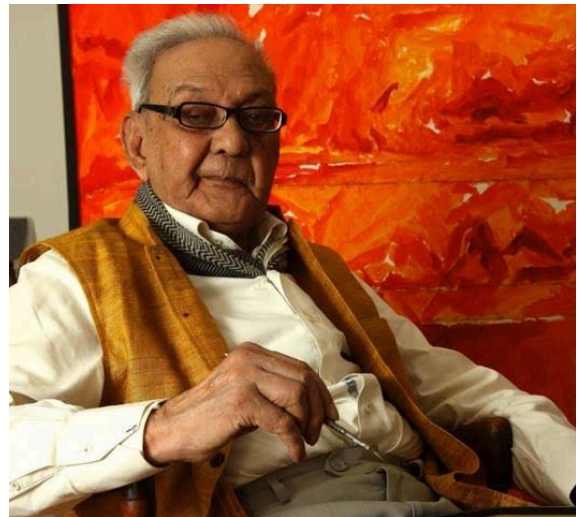
Jayasri Burman

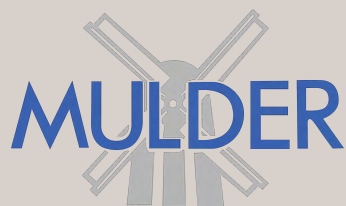
